**Re: HB 0203 – Training Repayment Agreements – Prohibition – Oppose as Written**

Dear Delegate Wells:

HB 0203 will prohibit Training Repayment Agreements. Such agreements are commonly contracts requiring employees to reimburse employers for training costs if they leave within a set timeframe. They aim to improve retention and recoup investment in specialized training, among other benefits.

This bill too broadly defines “Training Repayment Agreement”. For instance, does it include tuition reimbursement plans, or other types of *voluntary* education/training? Many employers offer to pay for degree programs or specialized training to attract the best candidates or as an employee retention tool.

Such programs allow employers to be more willing to fund specialized training, certification, or professional development. Repayment terms are normally prorated based on length of time (such as one or two years depending on the overall cost and extent of the training). The employer therefore realizes the benefit of that training in its workplace, and the employee receiving this training can enhance their worth both with their current employer and the marketplace as a whole.

The Carroll County Chamber of Commerce, a business advocacy organization of nearly 700 members, opposes this bill as written. We therefore request that you give this bill an unfavorable report, unless amended as noted above.
